CHRONOLOGICAL NARRATIVE

COMBOP OPERATIONS

AUGUST 1944

During the month of August, six missions were flown by the 89th Bombardment Squadron, totaling fifty-three sorties, with 89,050 rounds of ammunition expended in strafing, and 32.625 tons of bombs dropped. (1) This is an increase of 48,835 rounds of armament and 20.725 tons of bombs over the figures for July. As will be seen by consulting the map (Plate I), the great majority of both ammunition and bombs were expended in the vicinity of Sarmi.

Sixteen A-20Gs were assigned to the Squadron on 1 August, and the same number were in commission on 31 August. (2) No combat crew-member was lost during the month.

The first mission of the month was that flown by six planes on 4 August. The target was Nabire Drome, and twelve two-hundred-and-fifty-pound demolition bombs were dropped in the target area, but due to long-delay fusing no estimate of the damage could be made. (3)


At three o'clock in the afternoon of 7 August, seven A-20s took-off to hit Jap positions south of Arco. All planes reached the target, and three strafing passes were made at the target, which was pinpointed by smoke bombs dropped by an L-5. (4) No activity was seen at the target, but infantrymen later reported that the "questioning of natives from the AITAG-SA-LJA VILLAGE areas reveals that prior to the 3rd Group's strike of 7 August over 200 Japs had been living in the huts and coconut grove of LJA VILLAGE. The bombing and strafing of the 3rd Group was excellent, destroying all huts and shelters in the village and grove. A direct hit was scored on the hut containing the radio station, demolishing it completely. Less than 150 Japs are now living in very primitive shelters in the surrounding jungle". (5)

On 11 August ten planes hit Jap positions between the native villages at Foernes and Jansro, southwest of Maffin Drome. (6) Fifty-six two-hundred-and-fifty-pound demolition bombs were dropped, and two Japanese soldiers were seen; one of them ran from a hut just before it received a direct hit from a bomb, the other was on the river bank and was surrounded by tracers when last seen. For any others, propaganda leaflets were dropped. (7)

On 16 August Japanese bivouac areas on the southern slopes of Mt. Hakko, southwest of Sarmi, was the target, which nine planes hit with results unobserved due to long-delay fusing. No activity was seen in the target area. (8)

Combat Operations, August 1944, cont'd.

The same target was hit again on the 18 August, with nine planes over the target. Seventeen thousand, one hundred rounds of fifty-calibre ammunition and fifty-one two-hundred-and-fifty-pound bombs were expended in this typical minimum altitude attack, during which three passes were made at the target. Again there were no signs of enemy activity, and no assessable damage was seen to result. (1)

On 25 August, Jap positions near Foernes were hit for the second time, with twelve planes making three passes at the target assigned by an L-5. The target was thoroughly covered with bombs and strafing, but no damage was seen to result. (2)

DISINTELLIGENCE INFORMATION

August 1944

The 97th bombardment squadron (1) was scattered at the 563 during the month of August.

First Lieutenant Rover assigned to the squadron on the 22nd of August. Captain Waters transferred to the Group Headquarters, 3rd Bomb Group on the 22nd. Technical Sergeants Bruestle and Garrett appointed Master Sergeants. Staff Sergeants Miller, Long, and Thompson and Sergeants Herrera and Synesael appointed Technical Sergeants. Sergeants Bracey, Buckland, Canipelli, Hannin, Rosenfield, Szaban, Szuba, and Williams appointed Staff Sergeants. Corporals Looney, Tynkiewicz, Schulke, and Wilcox appointed Sergeants. All were appointed to these grades on the 22nd of August. (1)

AWARDS AND DECORATIONS

For the fighting men of the 89th Squadron, the month of August was a healthy one in awards and decorations. The War Department now authorizes the Veterans of the 89th Squadron to mount five stars on their Asiatic Campaign Ribbon for participating in the following campaigns: East Indies combat zone, Papua combat zone, New Guinea combat zone, Northern Solomons combat zone and lastly, the Bismarck Archipelago combat zone. In addition to these stars, they are also authorized to wear not four, not five but six overseas stripes on their sleeve for having completed over two and one half years of overseas service.

On 7 August, Captain Leland H. Waters was awarded his second Oak-Leaf Cluster to the Air Medal for his participation on the Rabaul mission of November 2, 1943. (1)

LOCAL INTEREST

The month of August, 1944, sees the completion of the first two years that the 89th Bombardment Squadron has been in combat in New Guinea. When the Squadron established itself at Port Moresby, the Japanese had pushed to within 32 miles of their field. All know the progress that has been made since that time. The lack of profitable targets now within A-20 range of Hollandia is not so generally known, but indicates a further retreat of the Imperial Japanese forces. Although targets were few and unprofitable during August, and although missions were few and uninteresting, the life of the squadron ebbs and flows as it has since January 1941 when it began.

Looking forward instead of backward, Captain Heyer, the Commanding Officer, received from his father a Duck Hunting Licence, state of Iowa, for the approaching autumn season. The Engineering Section took time off from its work of rebuilding a captured Japanese reconnaissance plane, to build a splendid frame for a large coloured photograph of one of the Squadron's own A-20s. (1) This photograph will hang in Captain Heyer's office.

The Engineering Section got hold of a Farmall tractor for light work. They also bargained themselves into a Japanese-built Chevrolet truck, which will be converted to a general duty trailer.

With a move in prospect, and with the move the possibility of interception, the gunners have been given practice firing missions. The Squadron has dropped barrels in the sea and then attacks have been made on them, enabling the gunners to fire the turret guns. Already the accuracy of the gunners has improved, and this procedure also indicates that closer coordination between pilots and gunners is resulting. New pilots assigned to the Squadron have had their share of orientation and training flights. The pilots have seemed to profit from them.

The mess improved considerably during the month, which is understandable when the "Fat Cat" and "Three Deuces", our B-25s flying between Hollandia and Cairns, are taken into consideration. Steel wool and red pepper at one end of the scale, fresh eggs, oranges, cucumbers, apples, celery, tomatoes, and lettuce at the other, have brightened the pots, the pans, and the menu. Beer was finally issued, and after the initial issue of six cans (which were warm) the freezer built by Sergeant Gruffer and Grazious was started. The next nine bottles were issued ice-cold, and what a treat they were!

Another treat, one which had not been waved before our faces for so long before we got it, was the "gravy payroll", which added about 33% to each payment of personnel made at this A&C during May and June. Combat whiskey continues to be issued by the medics, and needless to say it proves unfailingly popular.

The presence of ladies, both nurses and ACOs, in the area is attested to by the screens around latrines and showers. Immediately after the arrival of the new Squadron Bureau, new flower-boxes of an improved type replaced the old cans-full-of-rocks that used to claim our attention from time to time throughout the squadron area.

Captain of the Squadron Area, Jim Damon, always fan driving up to our section of the Jantang Valley would feel right at home. There before him is "Andy" (Ty. Rd.)⁽¹⁾ (the Australian influence on the New York idea) and through the cries of strange jungle birds, through the droneing of stranger jungle insects, he hears calls for "Little Isadore" or "Corrowful"—what is more, he hears answers. For the Squadron calls itself "The Characters", and the characters are from the Damon Canyon stories. (1) Captain Sue, lately of West Point, has drawn caricatures of each pilot, and Sergeant Tony Benson, lately of the 89th Squadron, has painted one on each of our planes. "Spanish John" (Lieutenant Loftus), "Hot Horse Hercie" (Lieutenant Akers), "Harry the Horse" (Lieutenant Autland), and "Slugsy Sachs" (Lieutenant Cornely), have all gone home. "The Brain", (Major Dow), and "Waldo Winchester III" (Captain Waters), have been transferred to 3rd Group Headquarters. "Liver Lips" (Lieutenant Craig) and "Angie the Ox" (Lieutenant Laddur) have been sent south for other work. "Good Time Charley" (Lieutenant Burke) is missing in action. But "Milk Ear Willy" (Lieutenant Anderson), "Corrowful" (Lieutenant Soloc), "Big Kig II" (Captain Folsom), and "Little Isadore" (Lieutenant McEvoy), as well as other and newer characters, are still with the squadron. Questioning of natives from the ALIPAS-SAI IJA VILLAGES areas reveals that prior to the 3rd Group's strike of 7 August over 200 Japs had been living in the huts and coconut grove of SAI IJA VILLAGE. The bombing and strafing of the 3rd Group was excellent, destroying all huts and shelters in the village and grove. A direct hit was scored on the hut containing the radio station, demolishing it completely. Less than 150 Japs are now living in very primitive shelters in the surrounding jungle.





JAPANESE CABINET RESIGNS. TOJO OUT OF OFFICE.

(TOKIO RADIO 20 July.)

On 18 July the entire Japanese Cabinet resigned and General Tojo went out of office. Officially announcing this, Tokio said that the Emperor had sent for the Lord Keeper of the Privy Seal, Marquis Kido. The announcement followed an earlier statement that Tojo had been relieved of his post as Chief of the General Staff. A few days previously it was announced that Admiral Shimada had been replaced by Admiral Nomura as Navy Minister. This drastic reshuffle, culminating in the complete collapse of the Tojo regime, is evidence of the alarm and desperation with which the unfavourable course of the war is being viewed in Japan. It may be regarded as a direct result of the Allied seizure of Saipan in the Marianas, and by the increasing Allied threat to Japan itself.

With the High Command fully occupied in preparing to stave off an Allied attack on the homeland, it is not likely that it will concern itself with the fate of the Japanese armies isolated in the Southern Regions. These forces no longer have any hope of further conquest; nor can they much longer retain what they now hold, in the face of vastly superior Allied forces. Abandoned as they are by the militarists who led Japan into this disastrous war, their wisest course is to bear with the inevitable now, and to coexist, so that they may help in the reconstruction of their country after the war.

Responsible Officers of the Japanese Forces!

We, as officers of fighting forces, admire the courage you have shown in gallant actions during many months under difficult conditions.

We think that the situation in this theatre has already become clear, and that further resistance on your part will serve for nothing but to prolong this tragedy of useless bloodshed.

We hope that you, officers who are responsible for the lives of your men, will not adhere to a useless "honour"; but that you will think of the precious lives of your men and of the anxiety of their parents, wives, children, brothers and sisters; and that you will arrange for the capitulation of those who have done their best as soldiers and human beings, so that they may live for the future.

It is no disgrace for an officer to surrender after he has done his best; when it is clear that death will not improve the situation of his forces. On the contrary, we think, it is true patriotism for him to save the lives of his men for the future benefit of his country.

Examples of this are not few in your country. Lieut-General Tatekawa, ex-Japanese Ambassador to Moscow, and Lieut-General Prince Asaka, are among them.

We repeat that we hope you will avoid losing uselessly many precious lives of those who are under the command of your Emperor, and that you will arrange the means for your men to serve the future welfare of their country.

We are prepared to negotiate with you for a conditional surrender which you can honourably accept.

We hope that you will send envoys without delay.
