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SECTION I

CHRONILOGICAL NARRATIVE COMBAT OPERATIONS

CHRONOLOGICAL NARRATIVE COMBAT OPERATIONS SEPTEMBER 1944

During the month of September, 11 missions were flown by the 89th Bombardment Squadron (1), totaling 102 sorties with 50.7 tons of bombs dropped on target, 14,500 rounds of .50 calibre ammunition expended in strafing and 11.1 tons of bombs jettisoned. (1) These compilations show an increase of 49 sorties, an increase of 18.075 tons of bombs dropped and a decrease of 74,500 rounds of ammunition expended in strafing as compared to the operations carried out by this Squadron during the month of August. The drop in ammunition expenditures is due to only one low altitude mission being flown this month. The 11 missions flown include 6 medium altitude bombing missions, 1 minimum altitude bombing and strafing mission, 1 sea search mission and 3 medium altitude bombing and photo missions on which the planes were either near or over the target but could not drop bombs or take photos due to weather or thick cloud cover. As will be seen by consulting the map (Plate I), Utarom Drome was hardest hit.


Sixteen A-20Gs were assigned to the Squadron on 1 September and the same number were in commission on 30 September. (2) No combat crew member was lost due to enemy action during the month, however one pilot was transferred. This loss by transfer was more than balanced with the assignment to the Squadron of two new pilots and six new aerial gunners.

The first mission of the month was flown by 11 planes on the first day of the month to Utarom Drome on the South coast of New Guinea. The A-20s, led by a B-25 dropped a total of 43 x 500# bombs with 95% of the bombs falling and bursting on the strip. The photos taken of the attack proved this to be the most successful medium altitude attack of the month flown by the 89th Squadron. (3)

Utarom strip was hit again from medium altitude on 4 September with 12 A-20s dropping a total of 45 x 500# 1/10 second delay fused demos. This mission was not as successful as the September 1 mission as several bombs were seen to land in water. However - damage could not be accurately assessed due to cloud cover over the target. (4)

The only minimum altitude bombing and strafing mission of the month was flown on 6 September by 11 A-20s which dropped a total of 40 x 100# 8-15 second delay fused demos on Nabire Drome and a total of 14,500 x .50 calibre ammunition was expended in strafing. The assigned targets of stores and personnel areas were well covered by the two bombing and strafing passes made. For the first time this month, A/A was encountered but was slight, medium and inaccurate with no planes being holed. (5)

Combat Operations, September 1944, Cont'd.

On 8 September, 10 A-20s again returned to Utarom with the strip as the target and dropped a total of 31 x 500# 1/10 second delay fused demos. Due to the cloud coverage over the target, damage could not be assessed. (1)

Utarom was again the target for 11 A-20s on 10 September, but even though all planes reached and circled over the general target area, at medium altitude, no bombs could be dropped due to cloud cover obscuring the Drome. (2)

On 12 September, 11 planes of the Squadron took off to bomb Babo Drome from medium altitude but due to cloud cover over the target, they bombed Mongosah Drome to the West of Babo instead. A total of 108 x 100# 1/10 second delay fused demos were dropped on the drome with 65% hits being seen through the thick cloud cover. No activity was seen in the target area. (3)

The first mission of the month to Babo was flown by 11 A-20Gs on 13 September. The target was A/A to the west of the main strip and 76 x 100# 1/10 second delay fused demos were dropped from 8000 ft. The A/A was well covered and several bombs were seen to burst on the north end of the strip. Accurate to inaccurate A/A was encountered but no planes were holed. (4)

The second mission to Babo was flown on 14 September by 11 A-20s, bombing from medium altitude. A total of 39 x 500# 1/10 second delay fused demos were dropped on and around the north end of the main strip. A good percentage hit the strip and several were seen to burst in the A/A positions to the west. One twin engine plane, serviceability undetermined was seen near the North end of strip. Some of the new pilots got their baptism of accurate A/A on this mission with one plane being holed by a burst of Heavy. (5)

Three A-20s took off on a photo mission on 19 September with the target being Sagan, Otawiri and Mongosah Dromes on the south coast of McClure Gulf. Due to the weather, the planes were forced to turn back 100 miles NE of the target. (6)

On 22 September, the Squadron ran its longest mission of the month when 3 A-20s completed a 6 hour sea search extending on a triangular course 350 miles out to sea from Wakde Island. The mission proved uneventful as nil enemy sightings were made. (7)

The final mission of the month was to bomb Utarom strip again from medium altitude on 23 September. However the 9 A-20s were forced to turn back West of Mios Noem Island due to weather and returned with their bombs. (1)




AWARDS AND DECORATIONS

On September 21, the 27th Anniversary of the 3rd Bombardment Group, a fitting cerimony took place on the grounds adjacent to Group Headquarters at 1 o'clock in the afternoon when General Crabb presented decorations to the fighting men of the Grim Reapers. (1) The officers and men of the 89th Bomb. Squadron received their full share of awards with 33 personnel receiving a total of 46 including 1 Silver Star, 2 Distinguished Flying Crosses, 1 Soldier's Medal, 7 Purple Hearts, 2 Oak Leaf Clusters in lieu of the Purple Heart, 27 Air Medals and 6 Oak Leaf Clusters in lieu of the Air Medal.

LOCAL INTEREST

LOCAL INTEREST

The month of September, 1944, was morale booster to the majority of the men in the Squadron, especially the original 3rd Group men with the July, August and September rotation lists being evacuated from APO 565 to APO 322 where they were given whatever clothing and ribbons each man will need to begin his U.S.O. "Commando" training throughout the United States. The remaining 47 old men of the Squadron are still sweating it out with the main topic of discussion being - Who are the lucky dogs to be leaving on the forth-coming October list?

On the 21st of September the 27th Anniversary of the Grim Reapers, the personnel of the 89th Squadron were pleasantly surprised to see the tall, well rounded familiar figure of Captain William W. Neel walk into the camp area. Captain Neel, former operations officer of the 89th Squadron, had just returned from the United States after more than a year of "Fat Catting" in the land of plenty. He soon found that he hadn't been forgotten and in short order he was surrounded by old friends who wanted to know how the morale was back home. He also recognized several new pilots whom he had helped train while he was home. Most of the questions asked by the old timers had to do with the liquor problem and the fame of the Grim Reapers there. Captain Neel said that whiskey is available at prices ranging from \$40.00 (12 quid to the older men) for a pinch bottle fifth of Scotch to \$35.00 for a whole case of Seagrams VO (full quarts, no pinch) and he says "I'll let you guess which was legal." The fame of the Grim Reapers is finally becoming well known in the States. He said that he had read several magazine articles about the Group and several features had been written in the Sunday editions. Pictures of the A-20s, Colonel Henebry and combat photographs had been published in all the larger papers. While travelling around the country he often renewed acquaintances of old members of the Group who are now training personnel in the tactics employed by the Grim Reapers. When Captain Neel left the Squadron in August, 1943, he had 56 combat missions to his credit. He had flown on bombing and strafing missions against the Japanese when they were some thirty odd miles from Port Moresby and had taken part in the Bismark Sea Battle. He had also seen combat action over Rabaul, Buna, Salamaua, Lae, Cape Gloucester, Gasmata and Finschhafen and had been awarded the DFC with OCL and the Air Medal and OCL.

Looking forward into the future instead of his past service on the beautiful tropical isle of New Guinea, S/Sgt. James "Crash" Lemoyne (former member of the 89th Squadron then on duty in the states) learning that he was on orders to be shipped to England for further active combat duty decided it would be best for his country, being patriotically inclined, and himself, if he were transferred back to the Southwest Pacific Area under the command of General Douglas MacArthur.

So one fine evening when "Crash" was unincumbered by the company of the fairer sex he scribbled off a few short lines and mailed them to none other than General Kenny, Commanding the Fifth Air Force. To "Crash's" utter surprise, the only answer he received was not a personal invitation from the General as he had anticipated but an order from mashington, signed by General "Hap" Arnold, granting him his request. "Crash" went home in May of 1943 and after spending 14 months in the States with plenty of fancy food and liquid refreshment, he pulled in at APO 565 on August 4, 1944, ready and eager to carry on the fight from where he left off. Lemoyne claims his biggest surprise was finding so many of the original 3rd Group men still in New Guinea after being overseas for 32 months.

This month, for the first time in a long while, the sharp ears of the personnel of the 89th Squadron picked up the sound of an enemy aircraft. All eyes were turned skyward, but nobody dived for a slit trench or was afraid of an enemy attack because it was a captured Type 100 2 ER Dinah 2 with AAF makings (1) and escorted by an A-20. It had been captured on Hollandia Strip pretty well beaten up after the Allied raids on the then enemy air base. The job of rebuilding the aircraft was given to the 89th Squadron and the responsibility of crew chief fell to T/Set Hawkins. Work started on May 20th and soon after when T/Set Hawkins was released to crew the Squadron's new A-26. S/Sgt Johnny Dugan took over the crew chiefs job with Cpl Tony Anselmo and Sgt Bodnar as his assistant with Sgt Bob Weister as prop specialist and Sgt Parrott and Pfc Schneider as sheet metal men to repair the 130 odd holes in various parts of the plane. Many long and hectic hours were spent by these men in repairing instruments, learning the functioning of Japanese installations, procurring parts and instruments from all over the southwest Pacific. Of the engines installed, one was slightly used and the other was captured new and all crated up. After many trials and tribulations the plane was finally ready to fly on September 3. Captain Leland Waters, formerly of the 89th Squadron, took it up on its first test flight which proved a success and since that time after a few of the bugs were ironed out, several more successful test flights were made. The Dinah is slated to go back to the United States to be tested so probably in the near future the folks back home used to the sound of Allied aircraft will look into the sky at the approach of the Japanese two Engine Reconnaissance Plane and then consult their Aircraft Spotters Guide. It will probably be out of sight before it is identified.
