1. The rellowing information is hereby submitted for the Squadron History for the month of December 1945.

a. Strength, Airplanes:

- (1) At beginning or period: 1 A-20G, 3 A-20H's, 14 A-26B's and 1 A-26C. Total: 4 A-20's and 15 A-26's.
- (2) Net increase during period: 1 A-26B-90 from 481st Service Sq. and 1 B-24M.
- (3) No. lost through transfer: 1 A-26B-50 and 1 A-20G and 3 A-20H's.
- (4) No. received through transfer: 1 A-26C-30
- (5) At end of period: 16 A-26's 1 B-24M
- b. The Squadren flew a total of 63 Patrel hourd while flying 16 Patrel Missions for the month of December 1945.
- c. A total or 177:30 was flown by the Squadren during the month.
- 2. During the month 1st Lt. Dan F. Miller was redeployed to the United States and 1st Lt. Clifford Haines succeeded him as Assistant Operation Officer of the Squadren. Also redeployed to the United States were Lt. John M. Venable and Captain John Lewis. The following Gunners were sent to the U.S for discharge under the present point system: S/Sgts., Cobb, Fancher, Harlin, McKenney, Clark, Beeras, Alspaugh, Gaul, and S/Sgt. Paul Campbell who was to be redeployed to the USA was killed in an accident involving a motor vehicle.

3. Training;

Due to the runway on Atsugi Airdrene flying was held to a brief minimum. As seen as the runway is fixed a rigid Training program is in store for the Flying Personnel of the Squadren.

4. Operations:

Throughout the month of December our Squadron flew a Recce on every fourth day due to the bad condition of the runway. Of course when necessity prevailed our ships took to the air whenever called on to do so. A B-2/M was added to our ships this month,; this ship is assigned to us for the Weather Detachment to fly.
