CHRONOLOGICAL NARRATIVE

CHRONOLOGICAL NARRATIVE

OPERATIONS

NOVEMBER 1945

With the entire personnel of the squadron now based at Atsugi Airdrome, daily operations became more and more a matter of routine as November days passed. The primary function of the squadron in its occupational life -- that of aerial watchdog on the regularly scheduled recco missions which, with the help of the other squadrons in the group covered the entire island of Honshu -- ran more smoothly as procedures and communications became standardized and pilots grew more accustomed to the terrain over which they flew. The 89th during this month put 42 patrol sorties into the air for a total of 101:35 hours. In addition, 75 training missions were flown and 137:35 hours logged during these flights. Since a number of pilots required new instrument cards, instrument flight checks counted for several of these training missions while formation practice and A-26 transition by former A-20 pilots accounted for the rest. Weather permitting, the squadron every fourth day flew

its turn on the courier run to V Bomber Command, situated at Tachikawa Airfield. On November 11, 1945, the Squadron flew 8 A-26's in conjunction with the Group in an Armistice Day celebration over Tokyo. This formation was part of an Air Circus held for the benefit of American troops in the Tokyo area. Little out of the ordinary occurred during any of these operations, although the squadron pilots had their share of blown tires which resulted from the extremely bad condition of the Atsugi runway. By the month's end, several pilots, navigators, bombardiers, and gunners who had received A-26 RTU training back in the States were assigned to the squadron and the 89th had almost completed its turnover from an A-20 to an A-26 outfit. With the A-20's set aside and non-operational in one corner of the field, the newer Invaders occupied the flight line. In late November however, the squadron's 15 operational A-26's were sharply reduced in number by a higher headquarters directive requiring that all but six be pickled.

The following data is taken from Final Mission

Reports located in the 3rd Bombardment Group (L) Intelligence Office files, and covers the recon missions flown during November:

1 November, FFO 275: Two A-26's took off from Atsugi Airstrip to observe lines of communication and airfield activity from Hamamatsu to Tsuruga to Aomi to Hamamatsu, central Honshu. The southern portion of this area was actually observed under CAVU weather conditions with light haze. Nil sightings were made and both planes returned safely to base.

2 November, FFO 276: Nil sightings resulted when two A-26's flew from Atsugi to recon lines of communication and airfield activity from Hamamatsu to Aomi to Sanjo to Atsugi, central Honshu. Due to inclement weather only the coast line in the Hamamatsu vicinity was covered by this flight. Both planes returned safely to base.

3 November, FFO 277: The entire area from Atsugi to 40° North covering the eastern half of northern Honshu was reached by two A-26's. Approximately twenty serviceable Japanese aircraft were being burned at Natsushima Airfield. From aerial observation it appeared

that Japanese were burning these aircraft. An American C-46 was sighted off the runway apparently mired in. Both planes returned safely.

4 November, FFO 278: Two A-26's covered the entire route from Atsugi to 40° North on the eastern half of northern Honshu with nil sightings.

5 November, FFO 279: The same area as covered on 4 November was flown over by two A-26's with nil sightings. Both planes returned safely to base.

7 November, FFO 281: Sent out to observe lines of communication and airfield activity from Atsugi to Sanjo to 40° North covering the western half of northern Honshu, two A-26's flew to 36° North, turning back at that point due to weather. Nil sightings made.

8 November, FFO 282: With the area Hamamatsu to Aomi to Sanjo to Atsugi, central Honshu, as their recon objective, two A-26's ran into weather which prevented coverage north and east of Nagano. Nil sightings.

9 November, FFO 283: Lines of communication and airfield activity from Hamamatsu to Tsuruga to Aomi, central Honshu, were observed as prescribed, two A-26's participating. One aircraft was seen burning at Ota Airstrip, 36°, 15' N; 139°, 15' E. A train of about 60 cars carrying ore on the Ogaki-Maibara RR was sighted.

Three Jap trucks loaded with what appeared to be Jap soldiers was seen three miles east of Sabae.

10 November, FFO 284: No unusual rail, highway or airfield activity was noted in the area bounded by Hamamatsu, Aomi, Sanjo and Atsugi, central Honshu, as two A-26's made the sweep.

11 November, FFO 285: Nil observations were made as two A-26's covered the area from Atsugi to 40° North on the eastern half of northern Honshu.

12 November, FFO 286: Two A-26's were unable to reach the area to be observed--the western half of northern Honshu--due to weather. Both planes returned safely to base.

13 November, FFO 287: The area situated between the towns of Hamamatsu, Tsuruga, Aomi and Atsugi, central Honshu, was covered as prescribed with nil sightings, two A-26's making the recco.

16 November, FFO 320-A-12: Area from Atsugi to 40° North covering the eastern half of northern Honshu was reccoed by two A-26's. Nil sightings made. Communication with "Boxer"--V Bomber Command control station--was very poor. Both planes landed safely.

17 November, FFO 321: Atsugi to 37° 10' North covered by two A-26's which turned back to base at this latitude due to bad weather. Nil sightings.

18 November, FFO 322: Pilots of two A-26's reported factories operating at Shimizu as they flew the sector Hamamatsu to Tsuruga to Aomi in central Honshu.

19 November, FFO 323: Southern half of the area Hamamatsu to Aomi to Sanjo to Atsugi in central Honshu reconnoitered by two A-26's. A late take-off prevented covering the rest of this sector. Mikatagahara Airfield reported under cultivation.

20 November, FFO 324: When one A-26 developed mechanical trouble and did not take off, the other A-26 continued alone to cover the southern part of the area bounded by Hamamatsu, Tsuruga, Aomi and Atsugi, central Honshu, with nil sightings made. Bad weather prevented reconnoitering of the rest of the sector.

21 November, FFO 325-A: Due to bad weather the area from Atsugi to Sanjo to 40° North covering the western half of northern Honshu was observed only to 37° 30' North. Two twin-engine planes were seen burning at Tatebayashi Airfield, while four twin-engine aircraft were seen burning at Airyu Airfield.

23 November, FFO 327: Three A-26's flew a search mission from Atsugi to Keijo, Korea, for missing C-46 but returned without sighting the lost aircraft. Search was called off.

25 November, FFO 329: The sector Hamamatsu to Tsuyama to Aomi, central Honshu, was partly covered to 36° 50' North where our two A-26's were forced to turn back because of weather. Unloading activity involving 15 - 20 small craft along the waterfront at Keiji Air-drome on Tsushima peninsula was noted.

26 November, FFO 330: The entire area from Atsugi to Sanjo to 40° North covering the western half of northern Honshu was reconed with nil sightings by the two A-26's making the flight.

Bad weather prevented all recon missions for the remainder of November.

NOVEMBER 1945

New Guinea, Leyte, Mindoro, Okinawa -- these former homesites of the 89th Bombardment Squadron (L) were now names of the past. Arriving during the last week in October, from Okinawa, after a seven-day LST voyage, the Rear Echelon had once again assimilated itself into the folds of squadron life and the 89th was whole and complete, rapidly adjusting itself to life at APO 328, Atsugi Airdrome, Honshu Japan. The difficulties of administration, heightened by the division of the squadron during the move into Nippon, lessened to a large extent. Redeployment and the assignment of new personnel to the squadron brought about a high percentage of turnover in the 89th's roster of men and officers. Homeward went 52 enlisted men whose point score of 62 to 70 met the requirements, while 6 officers with from 73 points up processed and were transferred to the 11th Replacement Depot to await transportation Stateside.

(As the 89th Bombardment Squadron (L) settled into its occupational duties during this month, more and more were some of its former squadron functions taken over by the Group. For example: The need for a Squadron mess officer was suspended by the consolidation of the individual squadron messes into one unit

for officers and one unit for enlisted men, operated by Group personnel. A group motor pool from which all squadrons took their transportation eliminated the need for a Squadron transportation officer. Group medical facilities, a Group postoffice, and a Group post exchange did the same in these other phases of former squadron activities .

AWARDS AND DECORATIONS

1st Lt. Robert R. Reyer

This pilot has been awarded the Air Medal (G.O. 2205 dated 24 November 1945) for meritorious achievement while participating in sustained operational flight missions from 23 February 1945 to 12 August 1945 over the Philippine Islands and Japan. Lt. Reyer flew a total of ninety hours and twenty-five minutes (90:25) of combat mission time during which hostile contact was probable and expected, in pressing attacks on enemy airdromes, installations, troop concentrations, supplies and communications in the above mentioned areas.

LOCAL INTEREST

One of the results of the movement to Japan and the consolidation of many former squadron duties into group activities was the loss, to a certain extent, of squadron individuality. Gone were the old days of squadron soft ball team rivalries, isolated areas, squadron independence. Squadron parties became group affairs, the messes were consolidated. Daily living turned less to the 89th and more to the 3rd Bombardment Group, so it seemed.

Beer issues continued with delightful regularity, and the Jap variety grew more and more popular. As Supply developed its sources of intake, cold weather clothing and OD's took the place of the well-worn sun-tans. Mount Fuji, its head and shoulders appearing from behind the intervening chain of hills, could be easily seen on a clear morning and each day the snow line descended a little lower. The steam heat and stoves in the officer's quarters and the stoves in the enlisted men's barracks became necessities rather than luxuries.

Chow, from most reports, was favorably spoken of by both enlisted men and officers. Except for the mess

supervisors, K. P. was no longer a detail, but just another task that the Jap labor had taken over. For more than one G.I. it was a pleasure to observe the job of potato peeling from the viewpoint of a spectator.

On 11 November 1945 some of the squadron personnel went into Tokyo to watch the Rodeo held in that beaten-up city's largest stadium. Overhead an Air Circus featured a large formation of A-26's from the 3rd Group, eight of which were flown by 89th pilots.

Work was begun on an Enlisted Men's club, as well as the improvement of the E.M. messhall and other buildings in the area. In the officer's barracks, the Club, Theatre and Messhall gradually took shape and it seemed apparent that the club, designed by Lt. Morganelli of the 89th, promised to be one of the best built in all of Japan. Besides these projects, gangs of "gooks" -- Korean and Jap labor -- worked at landscaping, at building the Chapel, at adding to the electrical system. Down on the line, F/O Mayhill, the squadron Engineering Officer, and his crew chiefs were doing a good job of maintenance on the A-26's. Just north of the officer's quarters a skeet range began to take shape and an 89th

Squadron skeet team seemed to be a definite possibility.

Thanksgiving -- November 22 -- was declared a holiday by Colonel Howe, but for many there was disappointment in the fact that the turkeys were frozen too solid to be thawed out in time for a Thanksgiving day dinner. The enlisted men, however, had their feast on the following day, while the officers waited until Saturday when they enjoyed, for all the wait, a delicious dinner with full trimmings.

So, for the most part, squadron life this month had begun to simmer down to a normal, unexciting, almost-but-not-quite Stateside existence. The morning struggle to awake, breakfast, the jeep ride or walk to the place of duty, routine matters, perhaps a recco to fly, chow, duty, an early dinner, movies for some, letters home, and bed. Now and then time off to visit Tokyo, Yokohama or Fujisama and the buying of souvenirs. The frequent recounting of points or months of service. These were the doings of most on an average day. A "fat-cat" life, compared to past war-years. But a life that all but a few wished to speedily leave.

PERSONALITIES

Captain Roy D. Burkhart

One tour of combat flying is enough for most any pilot. But "Burk", as his best friends call him, isn't just any pilot. As C.O. of the 89th Squadron since September 1945, he represents that aeronautical personage known as a "pilot's pilot". And to testify that he is also a "fighter's fighter" are the numerous awards and decorations including the Silver Star and nine Oak Leaf Clusters to the Air Medal which it is his right to wear.

Captain Burkhart followed the usual path through Primary, Basic and Advanced in learning military flying. He received his wings and his commission at Foster Field, Texas, on 5 September 1942 but this was not the first training in how to fly that he had undergone. After graduating from Sargent High School, Monet Vista, Colo., in 1938 Burk attended Colorado A & M for two and a half years and during that time flew Luscombes and Wacos under a college-sponsored CAA program, at the Massey Ranson Flying School. In between studies and flying

he sandwiched a membership in Alpha Gamma Rho fraternity, and played intramural football and basketball.

About six months from the time he won his wings, Captain Burkhart began his first tour overseas. On 3 March 1943 he left the U.S. to join the 89th Bombardment Squadron of the 42nd Bomb Group. Stationed in the Solomons and flying B-25's, Burk did ample during these critical days to help set the Japs back on their heels. During one of his 59 missions, while engaged in a strike at Kula Gulf on 20 July 1943 against enemy shipping, he made two bomb hits on a Jap destroyer, receiving official credit for its sinking. In addition he materially assisted in liquidating as much of the Jap fleet as he and his squadron mates could find on their frequent sweeps over the Solomon and adjacent searoads. On the completion of his first tour Captain Burkhart returned to the States where he trained further in the new A-26 Invader, piling up several hundred hours of flyingtime in that type aircraft. On 16 June 1945 he again left the States to begin his second tour and was assigned to the 89th Squadron a short time after the Japanese surrender.

Tall and lean, Captain Burkhart has more than won the respect of the officers and men within his command by his attitude of fairness and his ability to lead. As yet, his plans for the future are uncertain. The ranch life he followed in his pre-school and pre-war days at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. H.W. Burkhart of Del Norte, Colorado, holds an appeal for him that he finds difficult to deny. A purist on the subject of dry-fly fishing, he has an itch for the feel of a rod in his hand again. And hunting talk brings back memories too. Life with the Air Force of the occupation is all right. But a man misses other things too. At any rate, whether civilian or soldier, somewhere in the Captain's picture there will always be an airplane.

Staff Sergeant Robert J. McGowan

All his buddies -- and he has buddies by the score -- know "Mac" is Irish. His name, the touch of Eire in his face, sometimes by the way he talks. But especially because only an Irishman could handle the leading part in one of Mac's own favorite stories.

Playing basketball at Saint Mary's -- a combined grammar and high school -- in the city of South Amboy, New Jersey, where he was born, Mac achieved considerable fame in sport circles, enough to be named for the All-State basketball team during his final year at school. Naturally he was in no little demand by various South Amboy teams, and one night was rung in on the opposition by a YMHA five who were in need of a good forward. Complications arose, however. It hardly seemed that the name McGowan had the proper sound to it for the occasion, but this difficulty was gotten around by a small change in spelling and on the scoresheet McGowan became "Goldbergh". About gametime Mac's father, who knew nothing about his son playing for the YMHA, came into the gym. When he saw "Goldbergh" come down the floor with the

ball he almost had a stroke. It took Mac a long time to get back into his Dad's good graces again.

Upon graduating from high school, Mac decided he'd go where the money was, and went to work in the South Amboy Trust Company. It didn't take him long with his winning Irish ways and ambition to reach the position of Assistant Cashier -- a job he held at the time he entered the Army 10 April 1942.

Fort Dix, New Jersey, was his first stop. From there he went on to Mississippi and Keesler Field for Basic training. Before he left that southern state he saw service both at Laurel Field and Kee Field. It was while stationed at Laurel Field that his abilities were recognized and Mac became Sergeant-Major in one of the squadrons there. Finally, overseas duty beckoned him and after further training at Kerns, Utah, and Camp Stoneman, Mac began his overwater journey to the Southwest Pacific theatre, arriving at Hollandia, Netherland East Indies early in January of 1945, where he spent a few weeks in a replacement depot.

It was in February of this year that the Grim Reapers first saw McGowan. Originally entered on the

13th Squadron roster, Mac shortly afterward transferred to the 89th while on Mindoro. In the months that followed he became invaluable as an ordnance technician and loaded more than his share of the bombs and ammo the squadron A-20's and A-26's unleashed on the Nips. During those days baseball was the principal sport in the squadron life and Mac proved well able to fill the catching spot on the red hot 89th softball team -- called by some the best on the island. His keen interest in the game continued when the squadron moved on to Okinawa, and there as player-manager he assisted materially in winning many games and in keeping the team going despite player losses through redeployment.

As this piece is written, Mac is on his way home, probably somewhere on the high seas. Back here in Japan, he still figures high in the memories of those old buddies of his who are still sweating out the point score.






